As many of you may already be aware, Thy Kingdom Come is a special season of prayer, initiated by our archbishops, that will be taking place around the world (85 countries participated last year) between Ascension Day and Pentecost (May 10 - 20).

Plans are already well advanced for a special ecumenical Beacon event that will be held this year at Truro Methodist Church on Sunday, May 13.

If you took part in Thy Kingdom Come in 2017 or 2016, we very much hope you're planning to participate again and we would love to hear and publicise your stories from previous years – so do please get in touch with the Discipleship team.

If you haven't taken part before, we would love to encourage you to get involved in some way, whether as individuals and families, across your benefice or deanery, even beyond. The Morning and Evening Prayer: An easy to use booklet to encourage individuals who don't normally join in Morning and Evening Prayer, beautifully presented. With an encouragement at the end to keep going.

GRANT FOR ST MARY'S

Shevioc's St Mary's Church has been awarded initial support for a grant of £248,500 by the Heritage Lottery Fund towards the development of a Heritage Gateway to the Rame Peninsula. The church's team will initially receive a development grant of £36,000 to enable them to progress the project's plans with the aim they will be in a position to apply for the rest of the grant (£212,500) later this year.

SUPPORT SOUGHT FOR SAFE CAR WASH CAMPAIGN

Churches and individuals are being asked to support The Clewer Initiative's Safe Car Wash campaign which aims to combat modern slavery.

After Easter all clergy will receive information about the campaign, which officially launches in June, with a request for support. An app is currently being developed which will help people to detect instances of slavery when having their car washed and to report their suspicions.

The Clewer Initiative is a three year project to enable dioceses and wider church networks to develop strategies to detect modern slavery in their communities and help provide victim support and care. The initiative forms part of the Church of

England's approach to eradicating modern slavery.

GREAT SUCCESS FOR LATEST MEET THE FUNDERS EVENT

Representatives from more than 70 organisations gathered in Bodmin for the annual Meet The Funders event, writes *parish support and schools' advisor, Rebecca Evans.*

Organised jointly by Transformation Cornwall and the Diocese of Truro, the Meet the Funders programme is now entering its seventh year and continues to be as popular as ever for faith and community organisations throughout Cornwall.

This year's event was for the first time sponsored by Allchurches Trust and featured presentations and workshops from Big Lottery, Cornwall Historic Churches Trust, Parish Buying/2Buy2, All Churches Trust, Tesco Bags of Help, Joseph Rank Trust, Heritage Lottery Fund, Cornwall Community Foundation, Data Developments, Co-op Local Community Fund and Children in Need.

Average £60,000+ funding obtained

Back in 2014, some research into the impact of the Meet the Funders programme found that delegates at the main event had on average gone on to successfully apply for funding worth more than £60,000 worth per organisation.

The annual event is followed up by a series of workshops around the county to help organisations to develop their projects, apply for funding, monitor and report on their work, with the aim of enhancing their sustainability.
