Jubilee Celebrations in Ruan

On 2nd June at 6 pm the church held a special service to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Later in the evening, people went to Ruan High Lanes for the lighting of the beacon. Again, there was a very good turnout.

Sunday 5th June started with Holy Communion taken by Bishop Graham. A lovely service, including a sermon which we have not had for a while. Especially memorable for me, as my son's banns were read for the first time.

Preparations for the street party started at 11 am, with the bunting going up. The whole village was looking very festive. By 2 pm, after the road was closed, four marquees had been erected (in case of rain) and chairs, benches and the open backed pews from the church sat either side of a long row of all sorts of tables, the tables and marquees all suitably decorated in red, white and blue. The hog roast was smelling fantastic. People started to arrive just before 2.30 pm. Salad to go with the hog roast was in the Kings Head Pub and a huge array of heavenly puddings were on tables in the church. The sun shone throughout the afternoon, and it was great to see so many people (roughly 200) going in and out of the church, with many sitting on the grass, either side of the path. A fantastic afternoon was had by all.

We now look forward to 2nd July, when the church will be holding its annual cream teas. This will also be the start of the Art Exhibition in the church which will run for a week.

Our beacon above Carne Beach attracted about 200 people and it was great that we could see two others, Portscatho and a smokey Curgurrell. The Irish piper and young Oliver on the cornet set the tone for the night. Barry and his team lit the night sky up overlooking Veryan Bay, allowing us to reflect on the past and dream of the future.

The 70 changes on our six bells rang through the village reminding us of how lucky we are to have them and ringers who all reside in our parish.

The big day (Saturday) started dull but dry, with all and sundry checking weather forecasts for the dreaded storm. Luckily it missed us. All afternoon the sound of wood on coconut could be heard on Moor Launder. No it's not a new form of cricket – it was the coconut shy, along with boat races and ballon bursting to mention a few of the stalls that the kids had fun doing. The space hopper race proved a laugh and the tug of war was very competitive. The jury is still out over the result of the final pull between Mums and Dads!!

We asked for people to bring plates of food for the Tea and you weren't shy in filling the plates, with mostly home-baked items.


Our Parish Chairman swung the ceremonial sword to cut the queen's cake and we all sang the National Anthem. We think over 200 people took part in the "Fun".
